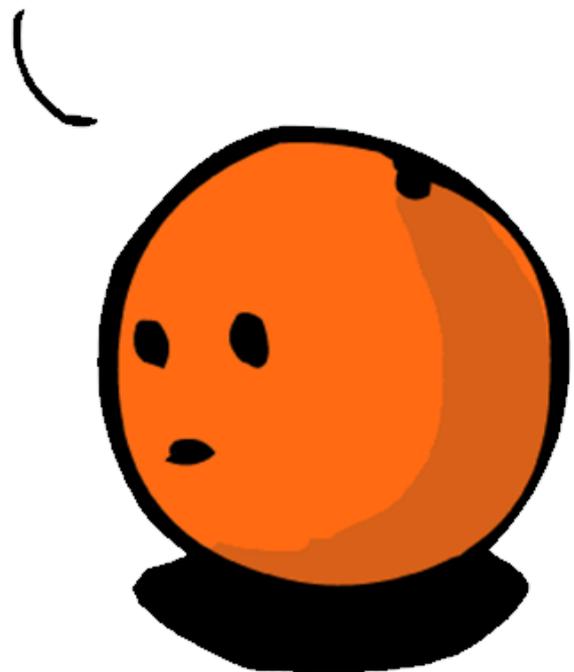
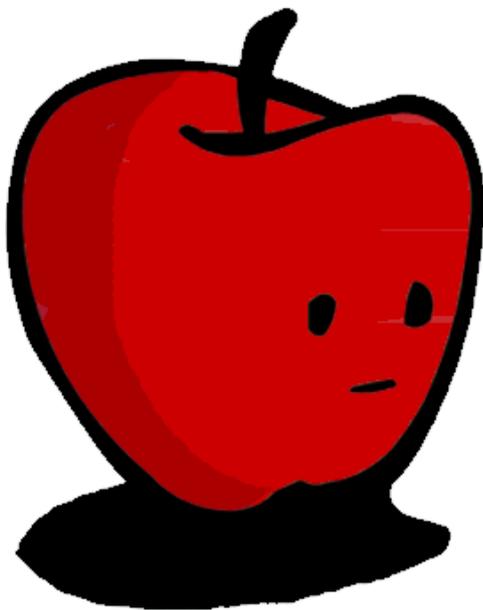


Comparing Open Source v Kontrolit

What is Open Source?

“Open Source” simply refers to computer software for which the source code is freely available for others to see and use. It’s often developed in a public, collaborative manner.

So it’s free, right?

That’s true, but only to a certain extent. It's only free if your time (and your developer's time) is worth nothing.

Yes, the install can be a 5-minute process, but what then? What if you want to add additional features like calendars, membership databases, directories, or e-commerce? It may not be so easy.

Comparing apples with apples

If you’re considering a new website, you’ll probably have done a little research and come across popular **open source software** such as Wordpress.

There are, however, important differences between Wordpress and Kontrolit which can have a far-reaching impact on your website. Before you compare costs, make sure you’re comparing like-for-like. There are some important questions you need to ask any developer using open source software.

Plugins & Extensions

Out of the box, open source software such as Wordpress runs on a very basic design template (called a theme), with limited functionality and features. There is often a choice of templates, but lots of other websites will be using them, too.



You'll almost certainly want to customise your website with your own design to reflect your company's brand, and add a variety of functions to suit your business needs.

Can you achieve this with Wordpress?

Yes...and no!

Design

No. If you want to move away from a standard open source template design, you'll need to hire a designer and a web developer to create something bespoke.

What will these professionals charge to create and implement your open source website design?

Functionality

Wordpress was originally intended for bloggers with very simple needs; it just didn't provide out-of-the-box features to create sites for businesses running ecommerce shops, memberships, events, booking systems or complex integration with CRMs.

So third party developers began to create **plugins** and **extensions**, pieces of open source code that Wordpress users can install freely or by paying a fee, download to add extra functionality to their own site.

Sounds great – what’s wrong with that?

You can end up needing a lot of plugins from a variety of different developers to make your website do all the things you want it to do. Unfortunately, sometimes plugins aren’t compatible with each other. When a conflict occurs, part or all of your website might stop working. There’s no way to anticipate the conflict in advance and when it happens, it can be a difficult job to isolate the plugin causing the problem.

Problems also occur when third party developers don’t keep their plugins and extensions updated. Eventually they’re no longer compatible with more recent versions of Wordpress and that can break your site, too.

If this happens you may have to choose between abandoning the plugin (and the feature it provides on your site), trying to fix it or finding another plugin.

How does your open source developer identify and fix incompatible and out-of-date plugins on a Wordpress website? What happens if a plugin or extension breaks your website?

Functionality & design on a Kontrolit website

Security & Updates

What security features does a Wordpress website provide?

“Open source” means you can customise the code to your heart’s content. This obviously has advantages if you want to add new features, but it also presents a weakness, giving bugs and determined hackers an opportunity to probe for a way in.

Security & updates: updating your Wordpress site

There are 6-12 Wordpress updates each year. You will be encouraged to always go to the latest version to prevent hackers gaining access to your site. With each version update someone will need to audit the site to check nothing is broken. You will then need to check for updates to plugins. If the main Wordpress software is updated and this breaks a plugin which does not have an update you will need to either look for a new plugin or abandon it.

Security & updates with a Kontrolit website

By keeping the source code for Kontrolit “closed”, at a stroke we are massively improving the security of our software. This means to date a Kontrolit site has never been hacked.

We launched Version 1 of Kontrolit’s CMS way back in 2002. Major updates are made approximately every three months between each Version. And because the modules which provide the extra features on your site are all owned and developed by Kontrolit, we can carry out thorough testing at every stage to ensure 100% compatibility with every update.

Admin Interface

How user-friendly is open source software?

The main reason most site owners want a content management system is so they can update their websites themselves, quickly and easily.

The admin interface of some open source CMS platforms is more user-friendly than others, but the level of control you're given over your website can be frustratingly limited. If you want to do something that your CMS doesn't allow you to do, you might have to go back to your developer to create a work-around.

What will this cost?
